Would you believe Mary Pollock, AAUWMI Government Relations Coordinator, is tracking 681 bills in the Michigan legislature? And those are just the bills that reflect AAUW's priorities!

Mary leads a "virtual lobby corps" of interested Michigan AAUW members who meet with her via Zoom on the 3rd Thursday monthly. You, too, could join the discussion; email Pollock at pollockm@comcast.net to be added to the notification mailing list. Sessions generally include a special guest and the AAUWMI Public Policy Chair in addition to Pollock's updates.

In this election year, noting the goals of our various elected legislators is vitally important. We are represented at the national level by Senator Debbie Stabenow, Senator Gary Peters, and Representative Dan Kildee. At the state level State Senator Kristen McDonald Rivet and State Representative Bill Schuette represent Midland County. Stabenow and Kildee are retiring at the end of the current term and McDonald Rivet is seeking to replace Kildee so there will be three seats to fill without incumbents. There already is a host of candidates vying for these open seats. Assess how these candidates reflect AAUW priorities and yours!

At the national level, you should consider taking action as a Two-Minute Activist on these topics at aauw.org:

- The Equal Rights Amendment
- The Healthy Families Act
- Fighting Attacks on Reproductive Rights
- Support the Gender Equity in Education Act
- Any of the other priorities under the "take action" heading.

Voting opens on April 3, 2024 and ends at 12 noon on May 15, 2024. An email (along with email reminders) will be sent to you from "Simply Voting" (an independent, third-party voting system). Paper ballots with instructions will be sent to those without e-mail addresses on file at AAUW National.
