MAY FINANCIAL NOTES

Financial Account Balances as of March 31, 2024

- The AAUW-Dearborn Business Checking Account Balance is \$21,406.54. This includes \$9,343.41 in the Marge Powell Leadership Fund.
- The AAUW-Dearborn Book Sale Accounts total \$19,869,66.

 This includes \$15,388.29 at DFCU and \$4,481.37 at Dearborn Federal Savings.

Dues News

April 1st was the "kick off" for the 2024-2025 dues collection. Branch member dues remain the same at \$101.00 (National \$72, State \$12, Branch \$17).

Members who did not join on the traditional membership year cycle (April-June) will have renewal dates based on their date of joining AAUW.

Branch students attending an accredited educational institution pay \$47.81 (National \$18.81, State \$12, Branch \$17).

New members or members lapsed for two or more years qualify for the Shape the Future Campaign and get 50% off national dues the first year (National \$36, State \$12, Branch \$17).

If you are interested in becoming a national <u>Lifetime</u> member, make a one-time payment of \$1,440 and never pay <u>national</u> dues again. (You still pay state and branch dues.)

As of January 2024, all national dues are fully tax deductible!!
