Our AAUW GP branch is celebrating 80 years of advancing equity for women and girls in the Grosse Pointe community!

The year was 1944 and World War II involved virtually every part of the world during the years 1939–45, dominating the lives of all. Franklin D. Roosevelt was president and in November 1944 won an unprecedented fourth term. The average cost of a new house was \$3,450.00. \$1 in 1944 is equivalent in purchasing power to about \$17.87 today. Sunscreen was invented in the USA by Benjamin Green (he was trying to invent something to protect soldiers in the Second World War from sunburn). The Nobel Peace Prize was awarded to *The International Committee of the Red Cross*. The most popular song in 1944 in the USA was "White Christmas" by Bing Crosby. Popular movies that year were "Going My Way," "Meet Me in St. Louis" and "Double Indemnity." Women wore dresses and skirts; slacks were not yet common. Women also commonly wore gloves, preferably matching their outfits. Working women wore khaki jackets, blue jeans, and wraparound dresses with fewer adornments.

There was much more to women's work during World War II than 'Make Do and Mend'. They built tanks, worked in rescue teams, and operated behind enemy lines. There were hundreds of thousands of military women who worked in crucial non-combat roles such as codebreakers, ship plotters, radar operators and cartographers. Often overlooked, their contributions have come into sharper focus in the last couple of years.

It was during this historical time, a group of women, led by Mrs. John Pear, established the Grosse Pointe Branch of the American Association of University Women in 1944. The branch was founded with the purpose of uniting college and university women in the Grosse Pointe communities for the improvement of educational standards, for securing broader opportunities for women, to further proper legislation in local and national problems, and for cooperation with the work aims of the AAUW.

Early branch activities included guest speakers on topics related to their stated purpose, sending boxes of supplies to veterans and communities in war-torn areas of Europe and Asia, and supporting local community efforts. The first fundraising activity, a used book sale, garnered much success and became an annual event. Proceeds went towards branch expenses and allowed the group to donate funds to local and international causes they deemed worthwhile as well as efforts spearheaded by AAUW National.

Over the years, our AAUW Grosse Pointe Branch has provided fellowship, programs, and opportunity to advance equity for women and girls in society. We can be proud of our 80 years of dedication and commitment to our mission. Let's celebrate together those 80 years on:


