



Public Policy News You Can Use



If you haven't voted yet in the AAUW election, please do that. The closing date is May 13 at 5 p.m. You received an e-mail from National on or about April 14, with the links which make voting easy. It includes your voter ID and a password. I found mine in my junk folder, so be sure to check there if you haven't seen the e-mail. Please see my message included in the April newsletter which outlines the proposed changes.

From the State and National

Despite the importance of early learning for children and the need for low-income families to have access to childcare, **Head Start** appears to be on the chopping block. Project 2025 calls for the program's elimination. The program had disruptions in federal funding earlier this year, and many federal employees involved with the program have been fired or placed on administrative leave. 2025 is the 60-year anniversary of the program. It might also be its last.

Head Start is just one of the social safety net programs currently targeted for cuts. Low-income families will be in a world of hurt if they lose access to Medicaid, SNAP benefits, and Head Start. Single mothers and their children face the greatest economic risk.

We are a non-partisan organization, but we have values and a mission. As an organization, we can advocate both for and against legislation that concerns women's equity, health, financial security, voting rights, and more. National is keeping a pulse on issues in DC and I encourage all members who might feel like they are struggling with where to start to sign up for **Two Minute Activist** at:




BOARD BRIEFS - APRIL, 2025

50 YEARS AGO IN 1975

AAUWNN Becomes a Reality

With assistance from State leadership, Karel Whitaker took the initiative and led the effort to charter a new AAUW Branch. On September 24, 1975, fifty-five area women signed a piece of parchment paper and became charter members of Northville AAUW.(Novi was added to the title in 1991 when the State allowed the joining of two communities to form a branch.)

Their first speaker in October 1975 was L. Brooks Patterson speaking on Michigan's probation and parole practices. They sponsored candidate nights with the League of Women Voters, held educational luncheons, collaborated with Schoolcraft College Women's Resource Center on a workshop for foreign newcomers and much more.
