The Passing of Mary Lou Angelotti by Carol Arnosky



Mary Lou Angelotti, an AAUW Midland member for 67 years recently passed at the age of 96. Mary Lou, a long-time leader of our branch, was Branch president from 1969-71 and a Named Gift Honoree in 1972. She also served as AAUW - Michigan president in the 1970's.

A few tidbits about Mary Lou: She was the first woman to major in engineering at what was then known as Western Michigan College in Kalamazoo. She graduated in 1950 with a Bachelor's degree in chemical engineering, then

continued her studies at Michigan State, earning a Master's degree in chemistry in 1952.

Mary Lou received recognition in 1987 during Michigan's Sesquicentennial, when she was among 150 women named as "First Ladies of Michigan", in honor of her work on behalf of expanding educational opportunities for gifted and talented students. Mary Lou was a long-time member of Book Lovers. While I was doing kids under five, hers were about to launch. She was knowledgeable about how the school system worked at every level. When it didn't work for our son with an unspecified disability, she encouraged my activism, never failed to remain interested and supportive. I admired the breadth of her community knowledge and always appreciated her friendship. -Pamela Murchison

Upcoming Increase in National Dues by Judi Cox

We want to inform our members that there will be a gradual increase in national dues over the next two years. The national portion of dues will increase by \$2 per year, with the first adjustment taking effect on **April 1, 2025**, and the second on **April 1, 2026**.

The updated dues structure will be as follows:

- 2025: National \$74 | State \$15 | Branch \$12 | Total: \$101
- 2026: National \$76 | State \$15 | Branch \$12 | Total: \$103

The board will review these changes at the next board meeting, and we will share further updates as they become available. We appreciate your continued support and commitment to our organization.
