Behind the Scenes at Midland Center for the Arts

On November 20 at 1:00 pm, members of the AAUW Midland Branch will enjoy a special "Hard Hat Tour" of the Midland Center for the Arts. This guided walk-through will last about 30–45 minutes and will offer a rare glimpse into the Center's ongoing renovation and transformation.

Participants should plan to arrive 5–10 minutes early and gather at the West St. Andrew's Road entrance on the north side of the building. Convenient parking is available in the library lot. Please keep in mind that portions of the tour will involve stairs, uneven surfaces, and limited elevator access, so attendees should be comfortable with walking and climbing stairs.

For everyone's safety, closed-toe, low-heeled shoes and long pants are required. The Center will provide all necessary Personal Protective Equipment (PPE), including a hard hat, safety glasses, and reflective vest. Guests are asked to stay with their group and follow all guidance from Center and construction staff throughout the visit. Because this is an active construction site, group sizes will be limited to 8–10 people, with consecutive tours scheduled if needed. Please bring only essential personal items.

This tour offers a fascinating opportunity to see progress on the facility up close and learn more about the Center's vision for the future. Attendees will also be able to sign up for project updates and future announcements from the Midland Center for the Arts.
