

#### Public Policy News You Can Use



The new **Michigan budget** has notable impacts on women's issues, including both positive investments and concerning cuts depending on which version or elements are considered. Key areas affected include healthcare, victim services, workforce participation, maternal care, and economic empowerment programs.

#### **Healthcare and Maternal Care**

The budget protects and maintains full funding for Medicaid and the Healthy Michigan Plan, which ensures continued access to healthcare for women, particularly in rural and underserved areas. Funding for maternal care programs, like the Maternal Levels of Care and the Michigan Clinical Consultation and Care (MC3) program, has been preserved. This supports risk-appropriate maternal care and behavioral health services for women and children, maintaining critical support for women's reproductive and general health.

#### **Victim and Survivor Services**

Proposed cuts to statewide victim services programs total \$4 million, which could result in an immediate 30% reduction in programming. These reductions would impact shelters, legal aid, and advocacy for survivors of abuse and assault. Many nonprofits that cater to women's safety and well-being are at risk of losing critical funding, raising concerns about diminished protections for vulnerable women statewide.

#### Workforce, Childcare, and Economic Security

The Michigan Women's Commission and related budget recommendations emphasize investments to improve access to high-wage careers for women by expanding tuition-free community college, skills training, and the MI Tri-Share Child Care Program. These initiatives aim to boost economic opportunity, support small business ownership, and open more pathways for women to succeed professionally. The budget continues this focus, highlighting the importance of both direct economic aid and systemic reforms to support women's long-term economic security.

#### **Broader Support and Recognition**

Additional acknowledgments such as WiHERed Day illustrate a state-level emphasis on celebrating and empowering women in leadership and entrepreneurship, emphasizing ongoing community and governmental support for women's advancement.

Overall, while the new Michigan budget contains robust protections and investments in women's healthcare and economic opportunity, it also proposes significant cuts that could adversely affect services for survivors of violence and organizations supporting vulnerable women. The true impact will depend on final legislative negotiations and implementation of these provisions.

WiHERed Day is a day declared in Michigan to recognize and support women entrepreneurs who play a significant role in the state's economy. Governor Gretchen Whitmer proclaimed October 4, 2025, as Wi-HERed Day to celebrate the resilience, leadership, and innovation of women entrepreneurs and leaders who (Continued on page 7)

are transforming lives, building wealth, and advancing communities across Michigan and beyond. The mission of WiHERed is to empower women globally, starting in Michigan, by providing community support, personal development, and entrepreneurial resources to activate their potential and strengthen their impact. WiHERed Day serves as a reminder of the power of women to rise above limitations, use their voice, and boldly lead in the marketplace and society.






